## Procedures

### Opening Committee:

- A. The committee will begin after a delegate Motions to Open Debate (Majority)
- B. Roll Call will follow:
  - 1. Delegates should begin with:
    - a. Present or Present & Voting

### Speaker's List

- A. Open the Speaker's List
  - 1. Delegate will open the speaker's list:
    - a. Country motions to Open the Speaker's List.
  - 2. The delegate who motions to open the speaker's list will either speak first, unless otherwise stated by the delegate.
    - a. This motion does not require a vote to pass.
- B. Set the Speaking Time
  - 1. Delegate(s) may set the speaking time by saying the following:
    - a. Country motions to *Set the Speaking Time to Minutes/Seconds*

### Caucus

- A. Moderated Caucus
  - 1. Delegates are encouraged to give speeches that will influence more discussion and debate
    - a. Stick to the country's policies and goals, and propose more ideas and conflicts.
  - 2. Delegates must motion to have a Moderated Caucus. Include the following:
    - a. Duration of entire caucus
    - b. Specific Topic
    - c. Duration of each speech
      - 1. Ex. Country motions to have (x) minutes moderated caucus for the purpose of discussing topic with X Minute/Second Speaking Time.

# Resolutions

Delegates will work together to draft a resolution that outlines a solution to the problem being discussed.

## Part 1:

The beginning of your Resolution is a Preamble. It contains the background and argumentation to the issue you have chosen. Include specific events, individuals, and actions. For this section of the resolution, you should start passages/sentences with the following phrases. These statements are known as Preambulatory Clauses:

## Part 2:

They should be organized in a logical progression and should reflect the existing policies of the delegation you represent. For this section of the resolution, you can use the following phrases:
